



## Camp Casey chosen beneficiary of annual volleyball marathon

Camp Casey will be the beneficiary of Walled Lake Western High School's fundraising 30th-annual Volleyball Marathon on Feb. 27.

The non-profit horseback riding program for kids with cancer was founded in 2004 by Molly Melamed, a Walled Lake Western alumna and former Farmington Hills resident.

In order to raise funds for Camp Casey, students find people to sponsor them as they bump through 20 hours of volleyball matches. With nearly 300 students expected to participate, Walled Lake Western has set a goal of raising \$30,000.

Camp Casey is a 501(C)3 nonprofit organization that provides therapeutic horseback riding programs to kids with cancer and their families. Serving families throughout Michigan, Camp Casey employs three unique programs: Cowboy Camp Outs, Horsey House Calls and Outlaw Outings. Cowboy Camp Outs are overnight retreats held at dude ranches in Michigan; Horsey House Calls bring Moe, Camp Casey's horse, to the doorsteps of kids too sick to attend camp; Outlaw Outings provide recreational activities, like professional sports games and ice skating, to families during the winter months.
