

PHOTOGRAPHER PROTOCOL



Creating lasting memories is a core component of Horsey House Calls, which is why the photographer plays such an important role! As the photographer, it is your job to capture all the magical moments of this very special day.

To be a good fit for this role, you must:



Have your own camera equipment



Have clear, timely communication



Have reliable punctuality and attendance



Be physically able to photograph a moving horse (walking short distances in outdoor summer heat)



Provide 100-200 high quality images within 5 days of the event

IMPORTANT REMINDERS



There are several shots we hope for from our photographers. However, the most important thing is the child's experience.

While we encourage you to interact with the participants, we also ask that our photographers take more of a "fly-on-the-wall" approach rather than a "paparazzi" approach.

While some children love the spotlight, some can feel a little camera shy, and our goal is for everyone involved to relax and have fun.

The most important aspect of all Camp Casey programs is safety. The Equine Therapist is trained in how to make every part of the experience as safe and smooth as possible.

When the Equine Therapist choses a location for activities or a route for rides, it is the photographers job to get the best shots possible without interfering.
